(In case you're wondering, the Monteverde ink is from their new "Seven Deadly Sins" series, and the Organics Studio ink is from their new "Monster Series".)

- 1. The permanent ink review is two places before Robert Oster Smoke & Mirrors.
- 2. The ink that clogs, the first review, and the shimmering ink are all different reviews.
- 3. The fifth review is either the ink that's two wet or the Glow-in-the-Dark ink.
- 4. The smudging ink is the next review after the not lubricated ink.
- 5. The clogging ink is not the third review.
- 6. Colorverse Fire Phasers is the next review after the non-lubricated ink.
- 7. The sheener is not the ink that's too wet (surprising, right?).
- 8. The clogging ink is not Noodler's N-95 (another surprise, no?).
- 9. The fading ink is two reviews after the permanent ink.
- 10. The too wet ink review will come sometime after the non-lubricated ink's review.
- 11. Of the fourth review and the review of Organics Studio Orc Blood, one is a shimmering ink and the other is too wet.
